## ESTIMATE YOUR WEB USAGE

You will find below a few non-binding guidelines in order to get a rough idea of your internet consumption on board. Your data consumption will depend on different factors. For this reason, those information cannot be considered as strict and are subject to quality of consulted images, videos, the size of e-mail attachments, etc...

### SURF THE WEB

Visit a simple home page (mainly text)	approx. 0.5 MB
Visit a comprehensive home page (images, videos, etc.)	approx. 2 MB

### SENDING RECEIVING E-MAILS

Sending / receiving a simple e-mail (text only)	approx. 0.02 MB (= 20 kilobytes)
Sending / receiving an e-mail with attachment	depending on the size of the attachment

### LISTENING TO MUSIC

Downloading / streaming a song	approx. 5 MB (1 MB per minute)
Listening to online radio (15 min.)	approx. 15 MB (1 MB per minute)

### WATCHING VIDEOS

Downloading /streaming a YouTube video (2 min.)	approx. 15 MB (full HD 1080p up to 4 MB per sec.)

### MAKING CALLS

Skype call (5 min.)	approx. 3 MB
Skype video call (5 min.)	approx. 20 MB

### APPS

Downloading or updating an app	up to 20 MB

## HOW IT WORKS

(1) Passengers connect to the onboard 'Hotspot' via their mobile device such as laptop computers or Wi-Fi enabled smartphones

(2) Data request is processed by the onboard connectivity server

(3) Signal is transmitted via satellite

(4) Internet service provider ground infrastructure processes passenger payments with Credit Card in real-time

(5) Internet-based traffic is managed by our service provider ground infrastructure
